## Job Description Prime Minister / Head of the State

## Scope

This JD is applicable to the role of prime minister or president in a parliamentary or presidential system respectively. The document is specifically designed for third world context, though it may be tailored to serve other contexts with some modification.

## Reports to

Dual reporting to cartels and foreign governments with good financial standing, hereafter called the stakeholders. Also reports to the local military establishment under terms of reference formulated by the stakeholders.

## **Key Responsibilities**

- 1. Primarily responsible to serve business and political interests of international cartels, foreign governments and interest groups
- 2. Acts as the stakeholder champion within the state in all circumstances
- 3. Interacts with cartels, donors and foreign governments to gather high level requirements of the stakeholders
- 4. Coordinates with civil and military establishment, agencies, consultants and subject matter experts to elaborate requirements in the local context
- 5. Engages economic, political and military advisors to design, develop, evaluate, initiate and administer programs and initiatives that meet stakeholder requirements
- 6. Strives to promote stakeholder interests preferably through a democratic façade, advocating them as vital public interests
- 7. Liaise with pro stakeholder media, lobbyists and other public interfaces to devise strategies and campaigns aimed at generating favourable general public response to aforementioned programs
- 8. Coordinates with civil and military establishment, and local agencies to effectively control and curb all forms of perceived or real resistance or threat to stakeholder interests, employing devices that include but not limited to cooptation, coercion, elimination etc.
- Strives to create favourable environment for stakeholders within key social institutions and state agencies, creating lobbies, bodies, structures, systems, laws and procedures that guarantee long term stakeholder interests
- 10. Establishes effective channels across all key social institutions and government agencies for regular and event based reporting to stakeholders, especially on sensitive matters
- 11. Takes legislative and strong administrative measures to timely curb any possibility of formation, escalation, activism or movement of anti-stakeholder actors or interest groups
- 12. Takes steps that assure mutual cooperation and information sharing among all pro stakeholder elements, either internal or external
- 13. Acts to provide agency services to the stakeholders in the region to meet any contingent political requirement
- 14. Branding and positioning the military establishment as the key national asset, more sacred and vital than the public itself
- 15. Granting public sanction to all military adventures sponsored by the stakeholders and providing effective democratic façade and ownership to every failed military campaign or controversial initiative
- 16. Performs any other duties that may be assigned from time to time by the stakeholders
